Google Classroom

#### **Google Classroom**

## **Flipgrid**

Flipgrid is a social learning platform that allows educators to ask a question, then the students respond in a video. Students are then able to respond to one another, creating a "web" of discussion. <u>Get Started</u> <u>Guide</u>

#### Khan Academy

Khan Academy offers practice exercises, instructional videos, and a personalized learning dashboard that empower learners to study at their own pace in and outside of the classroom.

#### Padlet

Padlet allows teachers and students to quickly and easily share interactive images, video, and text. It is much like having a high-tech whiteboard or bulletin board.



## <u>Zoom</u>

Zoom is a tool for conducting group and class online video discussions. It's only recommended for students and teachers with reliable high-speed internet access.



## <u>Whereby</u>

Whereby is an alternative to Zoom that works very well with mobile devices. Useful for small groups, student-teacher conferences, and tutoring.



## **Edpuzzle**

Edpuzzle can be used to make videos for your virtual classroom. It can also be used to adapt videos from other sources, like YouTube, Khan Academy, National Geographic and more, and embed comprehension questions, audio notes and voiceover in your video lessons.



## <u>Nearpod</u>

Nearpod is a tool where you can create polls, interactive quizzes, open-ended questions, slideshows, and videos for virtual classrooms.



## LabXchange

LabXchange™, a free online science education platform that provides users with access to personalized instruction, virtual lab experiences and networking opportunities across the global scientific community. LabXchange is purpose-built to drive more inclusion in the scientific process and spark collaboration to build creative, team-based approaches to real-world problems.(Harvard Faculty of Arts and Sciences)



#### <u>Skype</u>

Use Skype to send SMS messages to mobiles worldwide and with SMS Connect you can now also read and reply to your phone's SMS messages right from your computer. SMS connect will be released gradually. Video calls, SMS Connect, and voice calls.
